The author's revelations include: That the future president sabotaged the 1968 peace talks for political gain. The president had a drinking problem and top aides referred to him as "Our Drunk." Nixon had a misogynist streak and was abusive toward first lady Pat Nixon. The intimate and possibly homosexual nature of Nixon's relationship with confidante Charles "Bebe" Rebozo, a banker with mob ties.
